John Cousans

A poignant time has been reached in the history of Potto Parish Council. As the first issue of the parish newsletter is launched we sadly record the death on the 15th July 2003 of John Hart Cousans, former council chairman.

Previously a member of the parish meeting, John was a founder member of Potto Parish Council in 1969, and was appointed Chairman in 1976, remaining in the position until 1987. In 1992 he was re-appointed, holding this office until his untimely death in July 2003. Council members past and present wish to record his remarkable service to the parish, with grateful thanks for his support, guidance and leadership.

From a young age the church also played an important part in John's life, so much so that he became a church warden and a Eucharistic minister, assisting not only with services in the benefice but in administering to the sick, the elderly and those unable to travel to worship.

During the early part of his working life John qualified as a probate conveyancing manager, spending the latter fourteen years with John Tillotson and Co in Stokesley. His goal was to achieve 50 years in the legal profession. This he accomplished in 2003.

Having lived in Potto for thirty nine years, John's command of local history was outstanding. He was always happy to share his knowledge, conducting many walks and talks in the area.

Very much a family man he enjoyed time with his wife and children, and latterly his grandchildren, encouraging them to appreciate the wonders of nature and life's simple precious joys.

Small in stature , but with a big heart, John was widely known in many areas, and was greatly respected and loved in everything he did. His devotion, loyalty and gentle nature were just some of the attributes which made John so special.

He is sadly missed.
