Dot Peen Property Marking:

Dot Peen Marking involves using a tungsten carbide-tipped pin to indent an object with dots to create a visible, permanent unique number. The unique number will be entered onto the National Immobilise Property Register Database. It can be used on farm equipment, on garage and garden tools, power tools, computers and electrical devices, mobile phones and tablets, equestrian tack, golf clubs, musical instrument cases, cycles and much more!

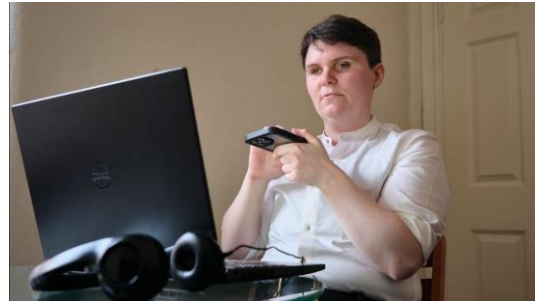

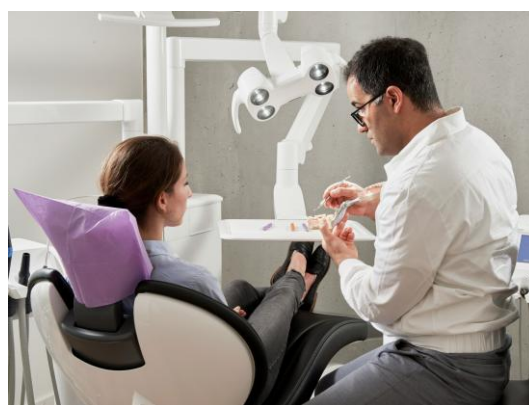

Recycle Week 2025 will run from 22 to 28 September, so save the date in your diary!

Objective is to drive recycling action, recycling more of the right things more often and to give everyday items their second chance.



Recycle Week is a celebration of recycling across the nation

WRAP is continuing last year's campaign theme, 'Rescue Me! Recycle', giving it a revamp and adding new household items. By giving commonly binned items a personality, Recycle Week is a time to focus on helping people realise that more of the things they've been wasting can be recycled after all. It's easy to rescue things like foil and trigger sprays from the rubbish and recycle them instead.

Through WRAP's Recycling Tracker, we know that 88% of UK households regularly recycle. This is a testament to the focus and investment from WRAP's citizen-facing brand Recycle Now and its partners over the years.

However, the data in the Recycling Tracker highlights that 87% of UK households recycle 1 or more items which are not accepted in the kerbside recycling and 57% miss one or more items which could be recycled at the kerbside.

"Before you throw, make sure you know!"
