Dot Peen Property Marking:

Dot Peen Marking involves using a tungsten carbide-tipped pin to indent an object with dots to create a visible, permanent unique number. The unique number will be entered onto the National Immobilise Property Register Database. It can be used on farm equipment, on garage and garden tools, power tools, computers and electrical devices, mobile phones and tablets, equestrian tack, golf clubs, musical instrument cases, cycles and much more!

We have opened an additional phase of public consultation in our review of North Yorkshire's electoral arrangements.

Our consultation will close on **13 October 2025**.

Our consultation focuses on new proposals for council division boundaries in:

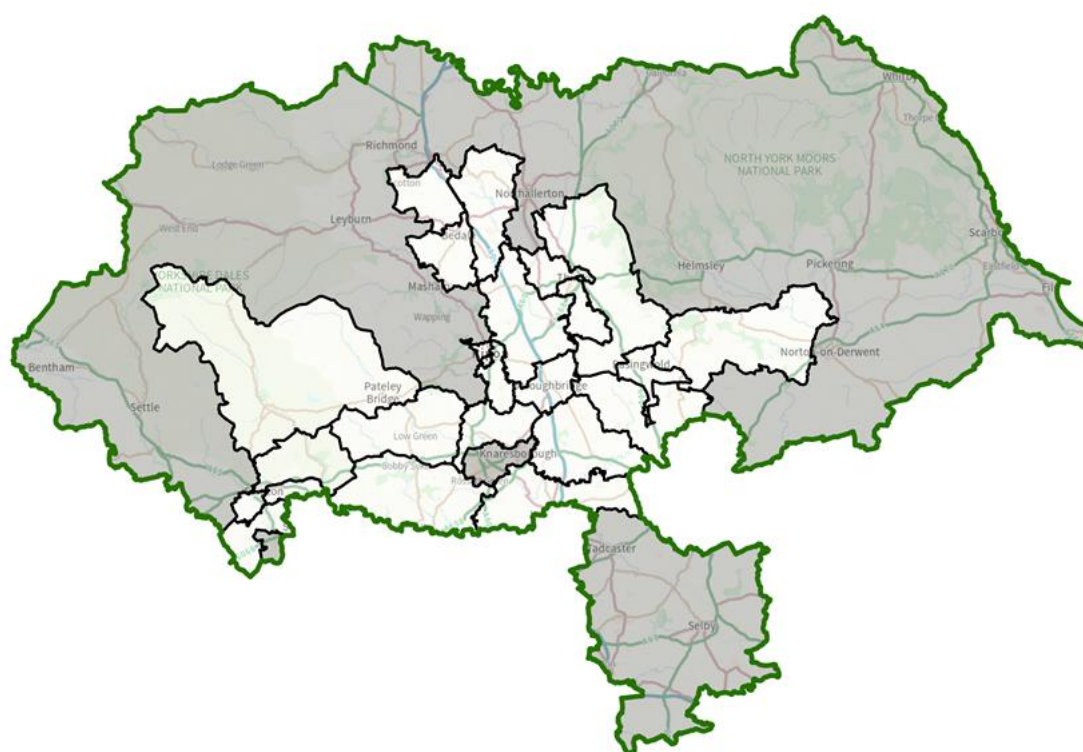
- 25 council divisions in the central and western parts of North Yorkshire.
- **The Commission is not seeking submissions about the rest of the authority.**
A full set of final recommendations for the council is scheduled to be published on 14 January 2026.

Due to the significance of the proposed changes made to these areas, we are opening an extra phase of consultation, for these areas only, to see what you think of the new recommendations.

We are satisfied that we have received sufficient evidence to finalise our proposals for new electoral divisions for the rest of the authority.

This period of consultation starts today, **2 September 2025** and closes on **13 October 2025**.

We will publish our final recommendations for the whole authority on 2 September 2025.

Ministry of Justice Updated Guidance on the Building of Crematoria

The Burials and Cremation Policy Team at the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) has written to SLCC with an update on a piece of guidance relating to the building of crematoria entitled 'The Siting and Planning of Crematoria' which was issued in 1978 by the then Department of the Environment (the '1978 Guidance'). Section 5 of the Cremation Act 1902 (the '1902 Act') states 'No crematorium shall be constructed nearer to any dwelling-house than two hundred yards [...] nor within fifty yards of a public highway.' 'Crematorium' is defined in section 2 of the 1902 Act as 'any building fitted [...]
